

## **STONY POINT TOWN BOARD MEETING – April 14, 2026**

The Town Board of the Town of Stony Point convened in Regular Session on Tuesday, April 14, 2026, at 7:00pm at the Stony Point Community Center, 19 Clubhouse Lane, Stony Point, NY. Supervisor Stamm stated that this meeting would be opened and closed in memory of Phil Marino.

Phil served our town as Supervisor from 2006 to 2008. During his term, he played a key role in the rebuilding of the Farley Bridge in partnership with Senator Morahan. Outside of his time in office, Phil was a dedicated presence at many town events over the years, including our Memorial Day Parade and 9/11 Services. He also served 42 years as a Deacon at Immaculate Conception Church and more than 25 years as Chaplain of the Wayne Hose Fire Company.

Supervisor Stamm called the meeting to order and led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

### **SUPERVISOR'S REPORT**

Supervisor Stamm reported as follows:

We have a number of great community events coming up during the months of April and May –

This Saturday, April 18 we will be hosting the annual Stony Point cleanup in cooperation with Keep Rockland Beautiful. The event runs from 9am-noon. Check in will be held at Town Hall anytime after 8:30. We will have bagels and coffee available.

Saturday May 2 is the North Rockland Sports and Law Enforcement Day. This event is from 10am-1pm at the Haverstraw Recreation Complex in Garnerville and it's free to attend. The Town of Stony Point participates in this event along with the Town of Haverstraw and the NRCSD. The school district will have several sports stations available for children to enjoy. The Haverstraw and Stony Point PD along with the Sheriffs Department will be participating in law enforcement demonstrations. It's a great day of activities for families.

Sunday May 3<sup>rd</sup>, the Stony Point PAL is hosting a 5k color run/walk event on the grounds of Farley Elementary School. Event begins with registration at 8am with a 9am start.

Saturday May 16 from 11-1 is the Stony Point Highway Dept open house hosted by Supt of Highways Karl Javenes. The event is free and is held at the Highway garage at 15 Rose Street. Free hot dogs and ice cream.

Monday, May 25<sup>th</sup> is our annual Memorial Day parade which kicks off at 9:30am on Ten Eyck Street, ending with our ceremony at Town Hall. More info to come.

Thursday May 28<sup>th</sup> is Stony Point night at Clover Stadium. Residents are invited to come out to the Boulders game; we will have vouchers for 2 free tickets. Additional tickets can be purchased for \$10. We will have more information on where to pick up vouchers available closer to the date.

Sunday June 7 is the 21<sup>st</sup> annual North Rockland Community 5k run/walk at Bowline Park. Proceeds from this event will benefit 3 local young people who are facing medical challenges.
