FROM THE SUPERVISOR'S DESK

As we move further into the spring season, I'm pleased to share several important updates and exciting events taking place throughout our community.

We are continuing to make progress on infrastructure improvements while also offering opportunities for residents to come together and celebrate all that makes our town special.

One of the most significant milestones is the completion of the **Champlain Hudson Power Express (CHPE)** construction project. This work included the installation of the electric line as well as related gas main replacement along Route 9W. Throughout the spring, sidewalk, curbing and other repairs are being completed by CHPE contractors along Route 9W north of the Farley Bridge, helping to restore damages due to the construction.

Looking ahead, the long-awaited **paving of Route 9W** is slated to begin soon. The project will start in Clarkstown and progress north into Stony Point. Park Road will also be fully repaved as part of this project. This important project will improve travel conditions as well as the overall appearance of our community.

I am also grateful to the many residents who participated in the streetscape public input sessions held in February. Residents emphasized the need for improved sidewalks and lighting, both of which are now underway. Beautification was another common theme, and we are developing plans to enhance several small parks along Route 9W, including Monument Park at Route 210, the Clock Park at the corner of 9W and East Main Street, and the World War I Spring Memorial. In addition, plans are moving along for the installation of our landmark flagpole and Patriot Park, located at the Commuter Lot.

In addition to these initiatives, we have many exciting events planned for the coming weeks.

I encourage everyone to mark their calendars and join us:

- **Highway Department Open House – Saturday, May 16**
- **Memorial Day Parade – Monday, May 25**
- **Stony Point Night at Clover Stadium (Boulders) – Thursday, May 28**
- **North Rockland Community 5K Run/Walk – Sunday, June 7**

Please come out and enjoy these fantastic events—you can find more information on our Town's website and on our Facebook and Instagram pages. I remain grateful for the opportunity to serve as your Town Supervisor and look forward to continuing our work together to keep Stony Point a great place to live. ■

Spotlight on Councilman Michael Puccio

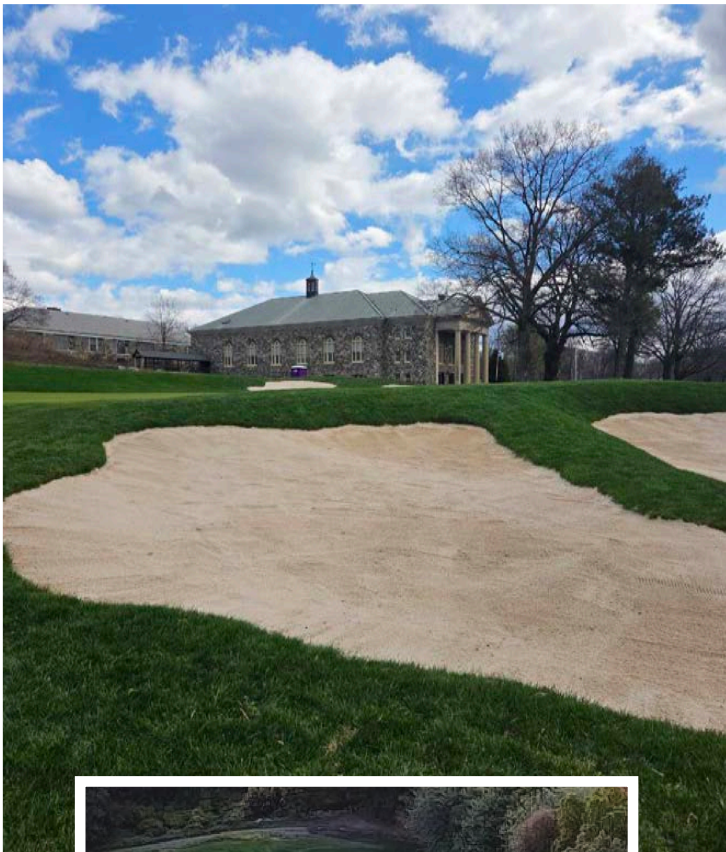

Highway Department Open House

Boat Launch Permits Required

A permit is required to use the boat launch at Clark Park and must be purchased in advance at the Town Clerk's Office (Monday-Friday, 8:00 a.m.-4:30 p.m.). Resident Permits: \$35 – proof of residency and boat registration required.

Park Restroom Renovations

Please note that bathroom renovations are currently underway at Clark Park, Charles Eccher Park, and Veterans Park and are expected to continue for approximately one month.

Spring Cleanup & Composting

The Stony Point Police Department continues to demonstrate its commitment to education, community engagement, and public service through a variety of recent initiatives and events.

North Rockland Youth Police Academy

We recently kicked off the Spring 2026 session of the North Rockland Youth Police Academy, which continues to grow and improve each year. This session includes over 30 recruits who will gain valuable insight into the hiring and background process required to become a police officer, while also learning about the many opportunities available through a career in law enforcement.

The Youth Police Academy provides an important opportunity for our department to engage with local youth, build meaningful relationships, and offer a better understanding of the work our officers do each day. A special thank you to Detective Andrew Kryger of the Stony Point Police Department and Detective Spatta of the Haverstraw Police Department for their continued hard work and dedication in helping keep this program running for the youth in our community.

PBA Blood Drive Update

The Stony Point PBA blood drive scheduled for February 23 was cancelled due to a snowstorm. We will provide an update once the event has been rescheduled.

This annual blood drive is held in memory of Jimmy McNicholas, who tragically lost his life in a hit-and-run incident in Pearl River on May 31, 2009. The individual responsible has still not been identified. We thank the community for its continued support of this meaningful event.

ATV & Dirt Bike Enforcement

As temperatures rise, we typically see an increase in complaints regarding ATVs and dirt bikes being operated on

public roadways. We would like to remind residents that these vehicles are not permitted to be used on public streets. Our department will be actively enforcing these violations, and any ATV or dirt bike found operating illegally on the road will be subject to impoundment. This enforcement is focused on safety, with the goal of preventing serious injuries and protecting both riders and motorists. We appreciate the community's cooperation in helping keep our streets safe.

Detective Bureau Investigation

We would like to commend our Detective Bureau for their work in addressing multiple community complaints regarding alleged prostitution-related activity at a local business. Working in collaboration with the New York State Police and the Rockland County Intelligence

Center, detectives conducted a swift and thorough investigation that resulted in an arrest and the closure of the business.

We also extend our thanks to the Stony Point Building Department for their assistance, including issuing multiple violations related to this case. This situation serves as a strong reminder of the importance of "see something, say something." Community members who report suspicious activity play a vital role in helping law enforcement address concerns and maintain the safety of our neighborhoods.

The Stony Point Police Department remains steadfast in its commitment to responding to community concerns, working collaboratively with our law enforcement partners, and upholding the safety and integrity of our town. ■
