FROM THE SUPERVISOR'S DESK

On January 1, 2026, I had the honor of taking the oath of office as your Town Supervisor, and what an incredible first six months it has been. As a lifelong Stony Point resident, there is no greater privilege than serving the community that has always been home. While there is still much to accomplish, I am proud of everything we have achieved together in such a short time.

During these first months, we have made meaningful progress on several important initiatives. We launched our **America 250 celebration** with a full calendar of community events, installed the beautiful **80-foot flagpole at Patriot Park**, began the long-awaited **streetscape improvements along Route 9W**, started **recording Town Board meetings** to make local government more accessible, kicked off the update of our **Town's Comprehensive Plan**, and will soon introduce legislation establishing a **rental registry** to help protect our neighborhoods and preserve the character of our community.

One of the highlights of the past six months has been our Town's celebration of America's 250th anniversary. It has been wonderful to see so many residents come together to celebrate our nation's history and our community. We launched a town-wide historical scavenger hunt featuring 46 clues, welcomed more than 75 participants, hosted a patriotic home decorating contest with more than 20 homes and businesses taking part, introduced Town of Stony Point merchandise that residents enthusiastically embraced, and capped it all off with a successful Town Carnival featuring rides, entertainment, delicious food, and spectacular fireworks.

None of this would have been possible without an incredible team. I am deeply grateful to the members of the Town Board, our elected officials, department heads, and Town employees. Their dedication, professionalism, and willingness to embrace new ideas have made my first months as Supervisor both productive and incredibly rewarding. I am proud to serve alongside such an outstanding group of individuals who work every day to make Stony Point a better place to live.

As always, my office remains committed to serving every resident with transparency, accessibility, and integrity. Thank you for your continued support and for being part of what makes Stony Point such a special community. I look forward to continuing our work together in the months ahead. ■

Latest Developments from the Highway and Parks Department

It's been another productive summer for the Stony Point Highway & Parks Department as we continue working on projects that improve our roads, parks, and public facilities while helping keep our community safe, beautiful, and enjoyable for residents.

We're pleased to report that summer paving projects are being scheduled soon, helping to maintain safe, smooth roadways throughout town. At Charles S. Eccher (Lowland) Park, restroom renovations are nearing completion and will soon be ready for residents and visitors to enjoy.

Our Town Pool and Splash Pad remain fully operational, providing families with a great way to stay cool throughout the summer months.

In addition to these seasonal im-

provements, we've completed several projects throughout the community, including resurfacing the basketball courts at Kirkbride Hall, refurbishing the front porch at Town Hall, installing new interior doors at the Patriot Hills Community Center, and installing the new 80-foot flagpole at Patriot Park along Route 9W.

Each event brought together residents of all ages while providing opportunities for families to enjoy safe, fun, and positive experiences within our community.

The PAL was also recognized during a special evening at **Clover Stadium**, where Detective Kryger threw out the first pitch. We sincerely appreciate the countless hours dedicated to making all of these programs and events possible.

Celebrating Officer Brian Horowitz

After 20 years of service to the Stony Point Police Department, Police Officer **Brian Horowitz** will retire on July 31st.

Throughout his career, Brian has served our community with dedication, professionalism, and integrity. In addition to his patrol responsibilities, he served as an instructor at the Rockland County Police Academy, a Field Training Officer, and worked with the Rockland County Intelligence Center.



Brian also played a significant role in strengthening our department's emergency medical response by helping develop our first aid program and securing Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) for every patrol vehicle and throughout the Town. He also coordinated the PBA's annual blood drive for many years in memory of Jimmy McNicholas.

On behalf of the entire department, I extend my sincere thanks to Brian

for his outstanding service and many contributions to the community. We wish him good health, happiness, and a well-deserved retirement.

Police Station Improvements

Several important improvement projects will soon begin at the police station. These upgrades will improve the safety, accessibility, and functionality of our facility for both our officers and the public.

Projects include:

- Paving and restriping the parking lot
- Replacing the front sidewalk
- Renovating the front entrance to improve ADA accessibility
- Installing awnings for patrol vehicles
- Renovating two station bathrooms

These improvements are being funded through \$227,050 in Member Capital

Grant funding secured through Assemblymember Chris Eachus. Construction is expected to begin shortly, with completion anticipated by this winter.

We appreciate everyone's patience throughout the construction process and look forward to providing an even safer and more accessible police facility for our officers and residents. ■
