WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States of America has designated the week of May 10th – 16th , 2026 to be dedicated as “National Police Week” and May 15th of each year to be “Peace Officers’ Memorial Day”, and

WHEREAS Police Officers’ Memorial Day is to be dedicated to Police Officers who have died in the line of duty, and

WHEREAS, the International Association of Chiefs of Police has requested that all municipalities honor Police Officers’ Memorial Day by flying all flags within the municipality at half-mast.

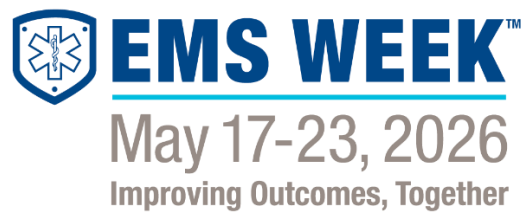

A motion was made by Supervisor Stamm, seconded by Councilman Williams and unanimously carried by a voice vote of those board members present with Councilman Joachim being absent to reject all the bids for Paving.

The following resolution was duly
offered and seconded to wit:

RESOLUTION NO. 13 OF THE TOWN BOARD TOWN OF STONY POINT REJECTION OF BIDS – PAVING PROJECT AND AUTHORIZATION TO PROCURE SERVICES THROUGH NEW YORK STATE CONTRACT

WHEREAS, the Town of Stony Point duly advertised for bids for a paving project, which bids were opened on May 7, 2026; and

WHEREAS, three (3) bids were received, as reported by the Town Clerk, from Environmental Construction Inc., Tilcon, and DeSimone's Paving Corp.; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has reviewed the bids submitted and has determined that it is in the best interests of the Town to reject all bids received; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to General Municipal Law §103 and applicable New York State procurement laws, the Town Board is authorized to reject all bids and may procure services through contracts let by the New York State Office of General Services when such procurement is determined to be in the best interests of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has determined that procuring paving services through a New York State Office of General Services contract will promote efficiency and potentially reduce costs to the Town.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, as follows:

- Section 1. The above "WHEREAS" clauses are incorporated herein as if set forth in full.
- Section 2. The Town Board hereby rejects all bids received for the paving project opened on May 7, 2026.
- Section 3. The Town Board hereby authorizes the Town Supervisor and/or such other appropriate Town officials to procure the necessary paving services through a contract awarded by the New York State Office of General Services, in accordance with applicable law.
- Section 4. The Town Supervisor, Town Attorney, and all other appropriate Town officials are hereby authorized to take such further actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.
- Section 5. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

Award Day Camp Transportation
