PROCLAMATION - ALS AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS, Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), known by many as Lou Gehrig’s disease, is a progressive fatal neurodegenerative disease in which a person’s brain loses connection with the muscles, slowly taking away their ability to walk, talk, eat, and eventually breathe; and

WHEREAS, every 90 minutes someone is diagnosed with ALS and someone passes away from ALS; and

WHEREAS, on average, patients diagnosed with ALS only survive two to five years from the time of diagnosis; and

WHEREAS, ALS has no cure; and

WHEREAS, people who have served in the military are more likely to develop ALS and die

from the disease than those with no history of military service; and

WHEREAS, securing access to new therapies, durable medical equipment, and communication technologies is of vital importance to people living with ALS; and

WHEREAS, clinical trials play a pivotal role in evaluating new treatments, enhancing quality of life, and fostering assistive technologies for those living with ALS; and

WHEREAS, the ALS Association, as the largest philanthropic funder of ALS research globally, has committed over \$154 million to support more than 550 projects across the United States and 18 other countries; and

WHEREAS, our commitment to accelerating the pace of discovery remains unwavering, fueled by the hope that one day, ALS will be a livable disease for everyone, everywhere, until we can cure it.

WHEREAS, ALS Awareness Month increases the public's awareness of people with ALS' dire circumstances, and acknowledges the terrible impact this disease has, not only on the person but on his or her family and the community, and recognizes the research being done to eradicate this disease;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jim Monaghan, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Supervisor of the Town of Stony Point do hereby proclaim the month of May 2025 as ALS Awareness Month in the Town of Stony Point. I call upon all Americans to join in supporting ALS research, advocating for increased funding, and standing in solidarity with those affected by this relentless disease.

WHEREAS, a written Petition dated **April 21, 2025**, signed and acknowledged by **Tim Schnittker, TDS 74 LLC**, has been presented to and filed with the Town Board of the Town of Stony Point requesting the Extension of a sanitary sewer and laterals in a proposed Extension of District **#2** to be known as the Extension of Sanitary Sewer District **#2** as more particularly described in said Petition, and

WHEREAS, the map and plan aforesaid has been approved by the State Department of Health, and copies thereof filed with said Department, and with the Town Clerk, pursuant to Section 192 of the Town Law.

Now on motion of **Supervisor Monaghan**, seconded by **Councilman Puccio** all members present voting therefore, it is

FOUND, ORDERED AND DETERMINED that said petition dated **April 21, 2025** for the creation of the Extension of Sanitary Sewer District **#2** in the Town of Stony Point, Rockland County, New York, is signed, approved and acknowledged, as required by law, and is otherwise sufficient and complies with the provision of Section 191 of the Town Law, constituting Chapter 62 of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York, and such other sections of said chapter as are applicable thereto; and that there is annexed to said petition a map and plans showing the boundaries of the proposed Extension of Sanitary Sewer District **#2** and a general plan of the proposed district, and it is

FOUND, ORDERED AND DETERMINED by the Town Board of the Town of Stony Point that it is in the public interest to grant the whole relief sought by said petition, and that all of the property, property owners and interested persons within said proposed Extension of District **#2** are benefited thereby, and that all property, or property owners benefited are included therein, and that no property or property owners or interested persons benefited thereby have been excluded therefrom, and it is

**RESOLUTION #7 ADOPTING LOCAL LAW NO. 1 OF 2025
LOCAL LAW TO AMEND CHAPTER 205 (VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC)
TO ADD PENALTIES ARTICLE AND INCREASE FINES**

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Stony Point, New York ("Town Board") from time to time reviews its laws, rules and regulations to be certain the same are consistent with all current lawful practices as well as best practices to protect the health, safety and welfare of Town residents; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board desires to adopt a Local Law to Amend Chapter 205 (Vehicles and Traffic) to Add Penalties Article and Increase Fines; and

WHEREAS, such introductory Local Law was introduced before the Town Board on May 13, 2025; and

WHEREAS, upon notice duly published and posted, a Public Hearing was held on said Local Law on May 13, 2025 wherein public discussion was heard concerning the merits of said Local Law and all persons were afforded an opportunity to be heard and the Town Board declared the public hearing closed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board as follows:

Section 1. All "WHEREAS" paragraphs are incorporated herein by reference as though set forth in full.

- Section 2. The Town Board hereby adopts Local Law No. 1 entitled, “Local Law to Amend Chapter 205 (Vehicles and Traffic) to Add Penalties Article and Increase fines” as attached hereto.
- Section 3. The Town Clerk is hereby directed to enter said Local Law into the minutes of this meeting and in the Local Law book of the Town of Stony Point, and to give due notice of the adoption of said Local Law by filing the Local Law in the Office of the Secretary of State in the State of New York.
- Section 4. This Resolution shall be effective immediately.

TOWN OF STONY POINT

LOCAL LAW NO. 1 OF 2025

LOCAL LAW TO AMEND CHAPTER 205 (VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC) TO ADD PENALTIES ARTICLE AND INCREASE FINES

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Stony Point, Rockland County, New York (“Town Board”) as follows:

Section 1. Legislative Intent.
 It is the intent of this Local Law to amend Chapter 205 (Vehicles and Traffic) to add penalties and increased fines for vehicles and traffic within the Town of Stony Point.

Section 2. Authority.
 This Local Law is enacted pursuant to the provisions of the State of New York and the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law § 10.

Section 3. Amendments.

Adding Article IX (Penalties).

The following chart sets forth the applicable fines and penalties for each section of Chapter 205 (Vehicles and Traffic), except as otherwise indicated.

§205-20/205-23 (Parking Prohibited)	\$50	
§205-20.1/205-23 (Additional prohibitions and restrictions)	\$50

§205-28(A)(28) (Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations)	\$200-\$500 (1 st Offense)	Not more than 15 days

The following sections of Chapter 205 are amended to read as follows:

§205-3 - The violation of this article shall constitute disorderly conduct, and a person violating the same shall be deemed a disorderly person and shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty as set forth in Article IX of this Chapter.

§205-6 - It is further ordered that all violators are to be prosecuted and, if found guilty of violating this article, to pay a fine as set forth in Article IX of this Chapter.

§205-10(b) Any violation of the provisions of this article shall constitute a traffic infraction and shall be punishable by a fine as set forth in Article IX of this Chapter.

§205-15(b) Any violation of the provisions of this article shall constitute a traffic infraction and shall be punishable by a fine as set forth in Article IX of this Chapter.

§205-23 - A violation of this article by leaving or permitting to remain parked unattended any wagon, motor vehicle, truck or other vehicle on any street posted with no-parking signs by order of the Town Board shall be a violation and shall be punishable by a fine as set forth in Article IX of this Chapter.

§205-31(B)(C) and (D) are amended as follows:

B. Every person convicted of a traffic infraction for a violation of any provision of this article shall be punished by a fine and/or imprisonment as set forth in Article IX of this Chapter.

C. Any violation of this article by a person, firm or corporation, other than a traffic infraction, shall be deemed an offense punishable by a fine as set forth in Article IX of this Chapter.

D. The violation of this article or regulations by trucks or the use of truck routes in violation of this law or the causing or permitting of truck loadings to fall on the highway shall be subject to a mandatory fine as set forth in Article IX of this Chapter.

Section 4. State Environmental Quality Review Act.

Pursuant to 6 NYCRR 617.5 (26) and (33), this Local Law is classified as a Type II action which requires no further review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

Section 5. Severability.

If a court of competent jurisdiction determines that any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance is invalid or unconstitutional, the court’s order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this Local Law, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

Section 6. Code Preparation.

The Town’s Code preparation contractor is authorized, without further action of the Town Board, to correct typographical errors, numbering and other related technical changes that do not affect or alter the substantive provisions of this local law.

Section 7. Effective date.

This Local Law shall be effective immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.
