This application for site plan approval is currently before the Planning Board and the project consists of the renovation and improvement of an existing Orange & Rockland Utilities, Inc. substation located in the vicinity of the Hudson River at 45 Elm Avenue, Tomkins Cove, NY 10986. This site is located within both the RR and LI zoning districts. The applicant, Orange & Rockland Utilities, Inc., is also required to obtain a Special Permit from the Town Board because public utility buildings and structures are proposed.

By Memorandum, dated October 24, 2022, from the Town Clerk, the Town Board has referred the subject Special Permit application to this Board for comment. Pursuant to Town Code Section 215-128, the Planning Board Secretary has referred the site development plan application to the Planning Board, which is currently reviewing the application for the purpose of site development plan review. At our meeting of October 27, 2022, this Board also reviewed the provisions of the Town Code and the general conditions and specific standards for Special Permits, including Sections 215-79 and 215-92.7, and has determined that a recommendation for approval of the Special Permit shall be made to the Town Board.

Accordingly, the Planning Board has authorized me as Chairman to transmit its recommendation for approval of the Special Permit to the Town Board by this Memorandum.

RESOLUTION

A meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Stony Point was convened on **November 9**, **2022 at 7:00 p.m.**

The following resolution was duly offered and seconded to wit:

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF STONY POINT DECLARING LEAD AGENCY STATUS REGARDING ACCEPTING PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO AN EXISTING CONSERVATION EASEMENT

WHEREAS, on October 12, 2022, the Tolake Corporation submitted a request to amend an existing Conservation Easement between the Town of Stony Point and Tolake Corporation; and

WHEREAS, the current Conservation Agreement extends to March 1, 2030; and

WHEREAS, Tolake Corporation is requesting to amend such Conservation Easement to add one (1) parcels of real property located in the Town of Stony Point into the existing Conservation Easement and to extend such easement to March 1, 2030; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board is the sole agency involved in the consideration of the proposed amendments to the Conservation Easement; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Part 617 of the implementing regulations to the State Environmental Quality Review Act, the Town Board hereby desires to assume Lead Agency status and thereby shall determine whether adoption of the proposed Amendments to the Conservation Easement would a have a significant adverse effect upon the environment.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is Resolved as follows:

- Section 1. The Town hereby ratifies and affirms each and every "Whereas" paragraph above as though set forth in full herein.
- <u>Section 2.</u> The Town Board hereby declares Lead Agency status pursuant to SEQRA in connection with amending the existing Conservation Easement Agreement between the Town of Stony Point and Tolake Corporation.
- <u>Section 3.</u> The Town Board further directs the Town Clerk and any other officer or employee, as directed by the Town Supervisor, to take any action necessary to carry out the provisions of this Resolution, and to transmit any required notifications to any and all potentially interested and involved agencies.
 - <u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution shall be effective immediately.
